It is no secret that we live in a divided and increasingly polarized culture. As founder of "A House United," and one of our Ella Dodd Distinguished Lecturers, Dr. Allen Hilton will help us understand this phenomena, and teach us new habits of tolerance, mutual respect, mutual learning, and collaboration. On topics ranging from from the political (e.g., immigration, size of government, gun control/freedom) to theological (the origins of evil, the Bible and homesexuality, the role of women in churches), Allen helps create generative, constructive conversations between people who disagree.

13 Dr. Budd Friend-Jones: Reverence for Life

Albert Schweitzer wrote, "Ethics is nothing other than Reverence for Life. Reverence for Life affords me my fundamental principle of morality, namely, that good consists in maintaining, assisting and enhancing life, and to destroy, to harm or to hinder life is evil." In this program, Budd Friend-Jones guides us as we explore implementing reverence for life in our own lives.

The persistence of religious violence in the modern world is one of the greatest conceptual and practical challenges our societies face. In this session, Rev. David Johnson will introduce some of the factors that make religious violence so intractable, and invites us to learn more through a Great Courses video class that will begin after the new year.
