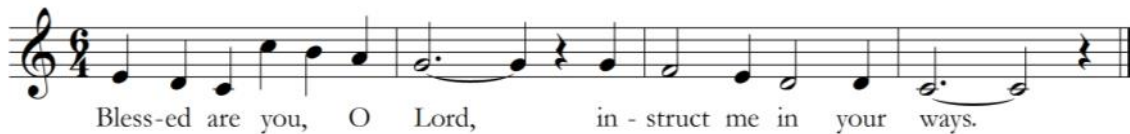



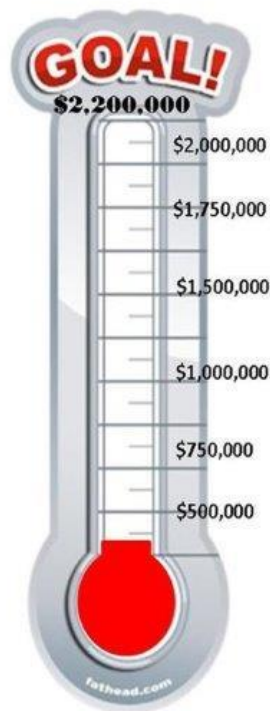

MISSION MINISTRY

MISSION WATCH: HAITI PARTNERS has a vision to help Haitians change Haiti. They seek to provide the skills and knowledge needed to be successful in life, family, and community; and, to prepare students to be active, life-long learners. Because they believe that how you teach is just as important as what you teach, they employ innovative approaches in the classroom in a joyful, loving, and creative environment. Understanding that Haiti’s problems extend outside the classroom, they also work with youth and adults providing programming to tackle deep cultural issues like women and children’s rights, positive discipline, entrepreneurship, and collaborative leadership. Community Church supports Haiti Partners with prayer, mission dollars, and visits to their Children’s Academy.

GLOBAL PRAYER PARTNERS: HONG KONG. Judy Chan serves with the Hong Kong Christian Council (HKCC). Medical service has been one of the significant areas of church mission for centuries in Hong Kong. The medical needs of Hong Kong’s 7.3 million residents are now largely taken care of by a system of public hospitals and clinics, where service is efficient and costs are low. However, hospital occupancy rates have recently been as high as 128%. Patient beds are added to overflowing wards, including in the corridors, leaving vulnerable groups, such as the elderly and ethnic minorities, at risk of being denied care. HKCC advocates for health care reform and access to basic medical care for all. **Prayer:** *O God, You are the healer of body, mind, and soul. Continue to pour out your healing grace upon the sick and suffering so they may find relief from pain, recovery from illness, and peace in their hearts. We especially remember the urgent medical needs of Hong Kong’s people and hospitals. May those serving and ministering in the medical sector be given strength to cope with the day’s demands. In the name of Jesus, the great healer, Amen.*

VISUAL ARTS EXHIBIT:

MICHAEL KEMP

Printmaker/Painter

Michael Kemp has a Masters of Fine Arts in Printmaking and graduated Summa Cum Laude from the University of Florida, Gainesville Florida. In 2011 his prints and drawings were included in the Anhinga publication "Derelict Tributaries", a book of poems by the poet Lawrence Hetrick. Working in a professional etching studio built into the uplands of Simonton Ranch near Micanopy Florida, Michael produces etchings from the center of the landscape. Using basic materials and methods, all prints are hand printed by the artist from metal plates made by the artist working directly from the landscape or from drawings of the landscape made by the artist. Michael has been working in the Alachua and Marion County landscape for 40 years. He is owner and operator of the Harmless Pleasures Printmakers Studio in McIntosh Florida located in the Icehouse Studios Complex.

"I would like to do Cezanne all over again from nature."

Direct study from nature using deliberate and thoughtful lines are the touchstones of my work in landscape and still life. I work directly on the plate or painting, sur le motif, as much as possible using an accumulative observational technique.
