

It is an impressionist piece of music - music that seeks to illustrate or convey a story. Dupré originally improvised this work as a series of meditations on

the fourteen stations of the cross interspersed with poetry of Paul Claudel. The result was such a success that he wrote it down, resulting in one of the most profound large scale pieces of the organ repertoire.

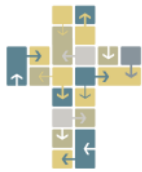
