Be thou and thou only the first in my heart: O Sov'reign of heaven my treasure thou art.



UPDATE FROM THE SENIOR MINISTER SEARCH COMMITTEE

As we all know, the coronavirus situation has changed virtually all aspects of our lives. The Senior Minister Search Committee is no exception, and we want the congregation to know where we stand.

First, the PAUSE portion - We are temporarily paused with candidates with whom we were already in conversation when the lockdown began in mid-March. We have used Zoom extensively to get to know them, but we have realized that...

- Candidates cannot travel
- We cannot travel to meet with them
- We cannot recommend to the congregation a candidate whom we have not met in person
- We cannot expect a candidate to accept a call to a church and a city they and their spouse have not visited

So our active discussion with candidates is on hold for now and will remain so until all of us can travel and interact more freely.

Second, we want the congregation to know we remain ACTIVELY AT WORK behind the scenes...

- We continue to receive names of possible candidates from church members and other sources
- Our committee members have become efficient at "digging in" and evaluating possible candidates, listening to sermons, and checking out how churches across the country are handling this strange time
- Because most large churches now stream their services, we can watch candidates and learn quite a bit about them before we even speak with them
- Using this time to plan for the next phase of our search is an effective way to "hit the ground running" whenever we are able to do so

Third, what are our EXPECTATIONS?

Given the state of travel and all the other unknowns of COVID-19 and a possible second wave in the fall, we currently believe it is unlikely that we will call a new Senior Minister by the end of the year.

We remain optimistic and more committed than ever to the task at hand. We are grateful that our leadership is in good hands and the church will remain strong in this transition period.

Thank you for the support you have shown us. Please continue to pray for our committee, our church leaders, and for our entire congregation as we go forward on the path God has planned for us.
