Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴ I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵ so that no one can say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶ (I did baptize also the household of Stephanas; beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷ For Christ did not send me to baptize but to proclaim the gospel, and not with eloquent wisdom, so that the cross of Christ might not be emptied of its power.

MISSION MINISTRY

MISSION WATCH: THE SOURCE. The Source began in 1995 as a fledgling homeless ministry, serving the needy by offering free meals and Bible Study in a tiny 600 sq. ft. storefront in Osceola Plaza. Nineteen years later, they have grown into a comprehensive assistance center dedicated to addressing the complex needs of homeless and poor living right here in our own community. The Source exists to offer life-changing possibilities to residents in crisis – offering emergency hunger relief, clothing, counseling, support groups, hygiene items, showers, mail and telephone services, benefit referrals, cold weather refuge, and so much more. Their “Dining with Dignity” program honors their clients and treats them with respect. Their culinary training program teaches clients restaurant skills and benefits organizations all around our community. Their art therapy program helps clients process the psychological and spiritual trauma that homelessness creates. Our mission dollars and our people support the important work that The Source is doing in our community.

GLOBAL PRAYER PARTNERS: HUNGARY. Priscilla Yang serves with the Reformed Church of Hungary. There is an amazing group of staff and volunteers at Kalunba Social Services Ltd. who work tirelessly to integrate refugees in a country, in a world where refugees are unwelcome. They provide essential services necessary for integration into society, including housing, education, and employment within a community atmosphere of loving, caring, open-minded people. Likewise, Temegén has a fantastic group of young people who work hard to make sure that the Roma (Gypsy) children in the district get the help they need with homework, projects, life skills, and making plans for their future. This after-school center provides a safe space for the children to be children - to play, laugh, question, do homework, and explore. The courageous and humble people who have answered God's call to follow in his steps are doing amazing things in the lives of those who need a loving hand to reach out to them. Prayer: *Redeemer God, we lift up our sisters and brothers in the refugee integration ministry and the Roma mission of the Reformed Church in Hungary. We pray for so many people fleeing their homes in search of a safe place to live as entrance requirements are becoming narrower and harder to pass, and families are being separated along the journey. We pray for the individuals and families in Hungary who are being neglected and pushed to the margins of society, for those who are being persecuted for their beliefs, for those who have come in search of a better life and a better education for their children. Give us courage to see our hurting neighbors and then humble our hearts so that we care for them as You would. Amen.*


