MISSION MINISTRY

MISSION WATCH - FEED THE LAMBS ENRICHMENT PROGRAM: The Feed The Lambs Enrichment Program works throughout Indian River County to provide recreation, education, and mentorship services for underprivileged children at no cost, who would otherwise be unable to obtain these services. The program utilizes volunteers as tutor and mentors, and benefits from Community Church mission funds.

GLOBAL PRAYER PARTNERS: EAST TIMOR. Monica Liddle serves with the Protestant Church of East Timor (IPTL). By 9:00 a.m. the line has already formed for the mobile clinic. Two Clinic Immanuel staff and a government doctor unload several boxes of medical supplies and start consulting. By the time the clinic is over more than 60 patients will have had the opportunity for health care they otherwise wouldn't have had. For 25 years now, Clinic Immanuel has been a steady presence in the town of Lospalos. Staffed by five women from the church, most of their work is outpatient care in this traditional clinical setting. But in recent years we have been developing an outreach to remote communities where the government does not have health posts. Health care is part consultation, part counseling, part education, and part social work, with each day begun and ended in prayer, always giving thanks for the call and opportunity to be part of God's mission in this part of the world. **Prayer**: *Good and gracious Shepherd, we have heard your voice and your invitation to follow.* From day to day, in many and diverse ways, you walk alongside us. You are at work in the rising of the sun and its setting. The intricacies of creation and human relationships show forth your presence with us. And for that, we give you thanks. On this day, we lift up to you the people of Timor Leste. We pray for the Protestant Church of Timor Leste and especially its vital ministry Clinic Immanuel Lospalos. Bless us with your wisdom, patience, and compassion. Guide us that with each person we consult we would see your own face. Amen.
