



# **MISSION MINISTRY**

MISSION WATCH: The Food Pantry of Indian River County was formed over 25 years ago, with the mission of providing food to the disadvantaged, unemployed and underemployed of Indian River County. In this role, they provide emergency food to residents and transients on a monthly basis. The Food Pantry of Indian River County is the largest pure food pantry providing emergency food to area residents. We are handing out grocery bags today and will gather in food and/or money next week to help feed the people of Indian River County. GLOBAL PRAYER PARTNER: Lebanon. Maria Bakalian serves with the Union of Armenian Evangelical Churches in Lebanon. This fall the Armenian Evangelical Church sanctuary was filled with over 300 students from kindergarten to high school, along with their parents, teachers, staff and school administration, and the congregation of one of the Armenian Evangelical Churches in Beirut. Each October the church dedicates its new school year to God, no matter what the uncertainty and turmoil all around. The Founders' Day Convocation at Haigazian University was a day later. Again, the focus was on thanking God for the opportunity to make a positive impact and prepare a new generation to serve Lebanon. Haigazian University has endured the Cold War, the unrest of the 1960s in the Middle East, the Lebanese Civil War from 1975 to 1990, with gun-carrying youths everywhere. Trusting in "the God of the living, not the dead," it made the students put their weapons aside and focus on learning. Despite everything, today the University and the church in Lebanon continue to trust in that same Living Christ. Prayer: Almighty God, today as we pray for Lebanon, we trust in your wisdom, patience, and authority. You know each of us, you know our questions and our needs. Grant us peace in this place where there is so much unrest and turmoil. As the country faces economic uncertainty and hardship, encourage us and give us hope. Help us to be confident in the certainty of your sovereignty and authority over all. Guide us to stand firm and focus on the living Word. Amen.


