




# CHILDREN AND YOUTH MINISTRY

#### **MISSION MINISTRY**

MISSIONS WATCH: SHINING LIGHT GARDENS: Started by Joel Bray in Winter Beach, Florida in 2008 and began as a backyard project expanded into a 10-acre farm. Joel's passion for farming is evident in the abundant cornucopia of crops he has produced year after year. He also has a passion for feeding the hungry, hence his motto, "Feeding the hungry, one garden at a time." Since then, Shining Light has been growing fresh vegetables to help feed the homeless, hungry, and forgotten. Their focus is strictly on growing and giving for God's glory. Community Church youth volunteer in their gardens and your mission dollars support their work on behalf of those who are hungry.

GLOBAL PRAYER PARTNERS: KENYA: Phyllis Byrd serves with the Organization of Africa Instituted Churches (OAIC) in Kenya. It's been only 3 years since Liberia was declared by WHO to be Ebola-free. The Mission of Hope is in the process of re-establishing themselves as an institution of excellence. The school sits on 500 acres of land and has become a lifeline for the community. The community benefits from the school's models for farming, fish ponds, and fruit trees such as avocados, grapefruits, almonds, and cashews. The Mission of Hope school has few resources, but big faith and a vision for the whole community. In addition to

re-establishing the school as an institution of quality education, they work with the community, area chief, and clergy to transform the surrounding area to be a village of hope where each takes on the responsibility of making the Sustainable Development Goals a reality in their village. **Prayer:** God of hope, we pray for the work of The Mission of Hope School - the work they are doing in the community and country as a whole. We pray that quality education would be accessible for all of the young people of Liberia. Amen.

Reverend Cynthia (Cindy) K. Schneider is a retired United Methodist Minister from Western Pennsylvania who
