Genesis 3:1-8

Now the serpent was more crafty than any other wild animal that the LORD GOD had made. He said to the woman, "Did God say, 'You shall not eat from any tree in the garden'?" The woman said to the serpent, "We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; but God said, 'You shall not eat of the fruit of the tree that is in the middle of the garden, nor shall you touch it, or you shall die." New Preaching Series: Please join us this fall for a new preaching series from the Narrative Lectionary. This week Rev. Dr. Anna V. Copeland begins the series with her sermon "Created Related" based on the Creation Story. On a four-year cycle from September through May each year, the worship texts sequentially follow the grand sweep of the biblical story, from Creation through the early Christian Church. These stories show the breadth and variety of voices within Scripture. They invite us to hear the stories of Abraham and Sarah, Moses and the prophets, Jesus and Paul. We will learn the stories of our faith in fresh ways, and listen for how God's action across the sweep of human history informs our understanding of complicated events in our world today.


RACE MATTERS


